### Enquiry Questions

How do plants, vegetables and fruits grow?

What are the signs of Spring?

How can you look after yourself?

### What is it all about?

During this topic, we are going to explore the season of Spring and all the new life that it brings. Through reading stories, we are going to learn all about the changes that happen in the natural world and ways in which we keep ourselves healthy. We will explore our environment and all the beautiful colours within it as the world around us begins to bloom. Throughout this half term, we are going to learn all about the story of Easter and how it is celebrated by Christians.

We are many amazing things... here are some examples:

- ...artists, we will be creating many colourful pictures.
- ...investigators, we will be finding out how the different weathers and seasons affect plants in the natural world.
- ...gardeners, we will be growing plants and finding out what they need to grow.
- ...caring individuals, we accept each other and where we come from.
- ...thinkers and speakers, we will be expressing our own ideas and preferences.

This is a six-week topic running until the Easter holidays. And will include a Stay and Play session for parents and carers.

<p>Using a pencil</p> <p>Draw a picture of something yellow/green/orange/black... and colour in your pictures neatly.</p>	<p>Feelings</p> <p>Have a chat about your day at school. Talk about when you felt happy, sad or worried and try to explain why.</p>	<p>Ball Skills</p> <p>What can you do with a ball in your garden or at the park? Have fun rolling, kicking, throwing etc.</p>
