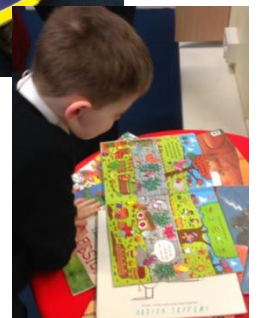


Reception and Year 3 on a trip to the library

Year Two

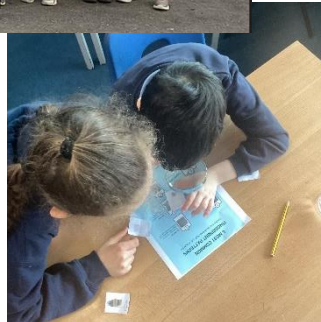

Year Five

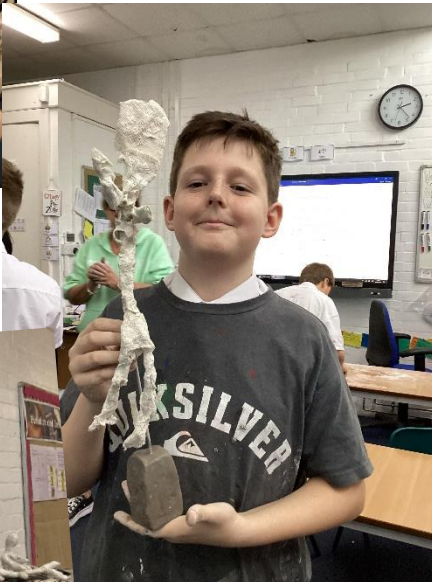

Anti-Bullying Ambassadors



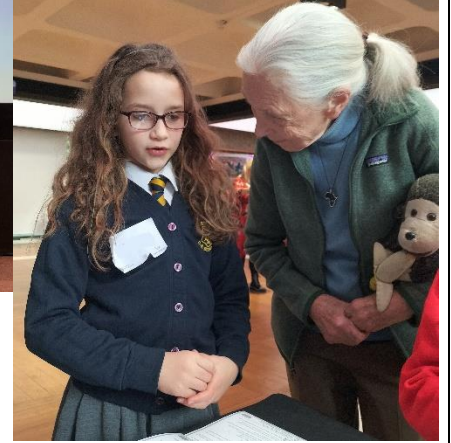

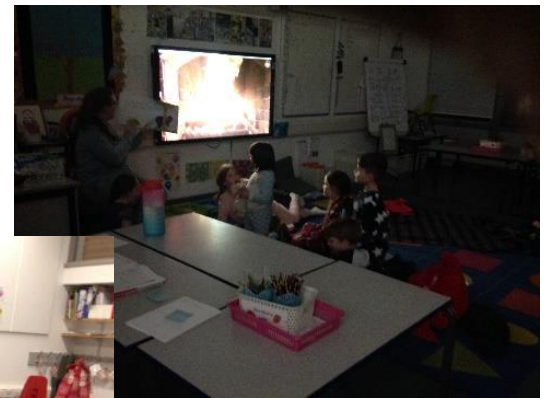
