National Curriculum

This half term in History, we will be delving in to the Roman Empire, discovering how Rome, from a small village, turned into the most powerful empire of its time. They will generate a chronologically secure knowledge and understanding of Britain from the first Roman invasion, until the time the Romans left Britain. In addition to this, they will address historically valid questions about what changes occurred due to the Romans, from the building of roads to Londinium. Finally, we will look at what evidence there is of Romanisation in the local area.

As artists, we will explore pattern and different types of printing. We will learn about tessellation and study different artists who create art by printing. We will investigate mosaic designs and patterns found in the Roman Empire creating our final piece, a line tile print fit for a Roman villa.

As scientists, the children will look at living things; classifying animals, looking at habitats and know that living things are divided into kingdoms. They will also plan and carry out a scientific experiment and record the results.

For computing, we will explore coding using if statements, coordinates and number variables.

Our whole class book will be Thieves of Ostia.



Over this half term, in Reading, we will be developing our comprehension skills by learning to scan a text to find answers to questions. We will use inference skills to understand how a character feels and what has led to their actions.

In Writing, we are learning to write sentences with accurate punctuation, including commas in a list. We are planning our own characters ad setting to write our own adventure narrative based on our class text and we will choose vocabulary that is fitting for the genre. We will also write an explanatory text based on our visit to Cranborne Ancient Technology center and the activities we take part in there.

Maths

Over this half term, we will be learning to build on our knowledge of place value understanding the value of each digit and how to partition.

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During the place value unit, we will be using number lines and improving our estimation skills. The children will be comparing, estimating and ordering numbers to 1000.

2+3=5

Linking with our Roman topic the children will learn Roman numerals. To finish the unit, the children will be learning to round to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

We will then move on to adding and subtraction 4 digit numbers and build on our confidence at using formal methods to exchange amount.
